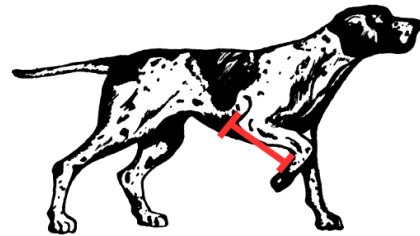
Registration: All dogs and all participants handling a dog must be registered with CHC and have an ID number. Please complete your member and dog registrations before entering our event.

Measuring your dog: All dogs must be measured to ensure they compete in the correct size category – small, medium, or large.

Measurements are taken from the inside bend of the wrist to the tip of the elbow; this measurement is the length of the ulna bone.

Division	Ulna Length
Small	5" or under
Medium	over 5" to 7"
Large	over 7"



There are now two entry divisions

- 1. Regular:** Dogs continue to enter by rules for size: Small, medium or large
- 2. Preferred:** "For dogs that find completing full courses too demanding due to physical challenges. This includes veteran dogs and those with medical or other physical conditions. The Preferred Division offers courses with shorter sequences"

Teams may switch from Regular to Preferred Division at any time and in any level from Novice to Proficient. Preferred courses have a maximum of **16 obstacles**, but all other aspects such as distance, bonuses, times and rules remain unchanged. Size measurements also remain the same: small, medium or large

Please note that once a dog has entered the Preferred Division, they must continue to run in that division and no longer qualify for the Regular division

Location: 2242 Upper Glade Rd, Glade, BC.

Directions from Highway 3A between Castlegar and Nelson: Turn onto Glade Ferry Road (across from the Esso Station). Continue down Ferry Road to the ferry. Take ferry across Kootenay River. After ferry, turn left at first intersection onto Glade Road. Then turn right onto Moraine Rd, then part way up the hill, turn left onto Upper Glade Rd. Glade Acres (Dan and Glenda Harris) is on the right at 2242 Upper Glade Road).

Levels Overview:

Beginners (optional):

Beginner is now an optional INTRO class for dogs that may not have the distance or skills required for the Novice level. Dogs do not require a title in Beginner to move to Novice but must enter only one level for each class

All dogs must title in Novice to progress to the Intermediate level

Beginner Level: 12-15 obstacles, spaced 16' to 18' apart. 20' for turns. Max distance challenge using CL is 25' to 30' and using DHB is 20' to 25'.

Novice Level: 15-20 obstacles, spaced 16' to 24' apart, allowing extra for turns. Max distance using CL is 35' – 45' and using DHB/DHA is 30' to 35'.

Intermediate Level: 18-25 obstacles, spaced 18' to 26' apart, allowing extra for turns. Max distance using CL is 45' to 55' and using DHB/DHA is 40' to 45'.

Classes Overview:

Hoopers Class: Courses designed using mainly hoops. One/two barrels or gates permitted in B/N. Points gained in the Hoopers (H) classes count for progression in this class only.

Parkour Class: Courses designed by using a combination of hoops, barrels, tunnels, and gates. Points gained in the Parkours (P) classes count for progression in this class only.

Tungo Class: Courses designed by using mainly barrels and tunnels; 1-2 gates are permitted. Hoops are used at the start/finish. Points gained in the Tungo (T) classes count for progression in this class only.

NEW Challenge Class: A distance handling only class, with one distance challenge. Running with your dog is not permitted for the CHC Challenge Class

The final score is determined by subtracting any faults from the maximum bonus points available: 20 for DHB/DHA or 15 for CL. However, if the handler steps on or outside the handling area boundary, the team is eliminated and receives no score for that run.

They may, however, choose to complete the course

Earning Class Points: Points are earned by completing a run without faults and under course time (a “clean run”).

Clean run, under 45 seconds: 10 points

Clean run, under 90 seconds: 5 points

Earning Extra (Bonus) Points (does not apply to Challenge Class): Extra points are earned by successfully completing the distance challenge; the team must also be clean under course time.

Distance handling box: 5-20 points Challenge lines (B/N/I): 5-15 points
