Registration: All dogs and all participants handling a dog must be registered with CHC and have an ID number. Please complete your member and dog registrations before entering our event.



Measuring your dog: All dogs must be measured to ensure they compete in the correct size category – small, medium, or large.


Measurements are taken from the inside bend of the wrist to the tip of the elbow; this measurement is the length of the ulna bone.

Division	Ulna Length
Small	5" or under
Medium	over 5" to 7"
Large	over 7"



Levels Overview:

Beginners level: Courses of 15-20 obstacles, spaced 15-26 feet apart. Distance challenges can be distance handling boxes (DHB) or challenge lines (CL). 100 points in each class are required to earn the class title.



Classes Overview:

Hoopers class: Courses designed using mainly hoops. One barrel or gate is permitted in B/N. Points gained in the Hoopers (H) classes count for progression in this class only.

Parkours class: Courses designed by using a combination of hoops, barrels, tunnels, and gates. Points gained in the Parkours (P) classes count for progression in this class only.

Tungo class: Courses designed by using mainly barrels and tunnels; 1-2 gates are permitted. Hoops are used at the start/finish. Points gained in the Tungo (T) classes count for progression in this class only.

Earning Class Points: Points are earned by completing a run without faults and under course time (a "clean run").

Clean run, under 45 seconds: 10 points Clean run, under 90 seconds: 5 points

Earning Extra/Bonus Points: Extra points are earned by successfully completing the distance challenge; the team must also be clean under course time.

Distance handling box: 5-20 points Challenge lines (B/N/I): 5-15 points

The fastest clean dog in each category (s/m/l) will be awarded additional points; the team must also run clean and be under course time.

Fastest dog: 5 points

Disclaimer: CHC & MDS rules

1. [CHC/MDS] All dogs and persons entered at Canine Hoopers of Canada trials are entered at their own risk. While every care will be taken to ensure the health and safety of all competitors and spectators, Canine Hoopers of Canada and any subsequent trial hosts will not be held responsible for loss, damage, or injury, however caused, to dogs, persons, or property while at its events.

Judges have the authority to dismiss dogs and handlers from their rings. The judge's decision is final. Trial hosts have the authority to dismiss any dog or person from the trial venue, without a refund. The trial host's decision is final. **2.** [CHC] Dogs that are ill, or have been in contact with dogs that are ill, must not be brought to the trial venue.

[MDS] Dogs that appear to be ill or injured will be dismissed from the event. Refunds may or may not be available depending on the circumstances; any refunds given

3. [CHC] Bitches in season are allowed to compete but must wear protective pants during their run. They must also be kept on lead and away from the ring areas when not competing.

[MDS] Pants should also include a built-in liner, or have an absorbent liner added.

4. [CHC/MDS] Competitors are responsible for ensuring their dog is adequately trained to a safe standard for the nature of the competition entered.

5. [CHC] No person shall carry out any physical disciplining or excessive harsh corrections of a dog at any time during the competition.

[MDS] Any person who delivers what appears to be a physical or verbal correction that causes the dog to shy or cower, or offends the sense of the judge, event host or facility owner, will be dismissed from the trial. No refunds will be issued in their circumstance.

6. [CHC] All dogs must be kept under proper control in all areas of the trial venue. All persons are expected to respect space from other dogs and handlers. Dogs are not permitted to lunge at the rings, other competitors or their dogs. All persons are to keep 6' back from the ring boundary when in use.

[MDS] Handlers who cannot manage their dog's behaviour by providing distractions or engagement, or do not manage their distance from others or the ring will be dismissed from the trial. No refunds will be issued in their circumstance.

7. [CHC] Choke collars, harnesses or head collars are not permitted in the ring.

[MDS] Correction collars are banned from the trial property; this includes choke collars, pinch collars, slip and limited slip leads made of rope, any collar or lead around the dog's neck that is less than 1/4" in width, or any collar or device placed on the neck or body that delivers a shock, audible tone, or spray.

Slip and limited-slip **sport leads** are permitted so long as they do not cause a dog to cough or choke.

8. [CHC/MDS] Handlers are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs in all areas of the trial venue.

[MDS] Handlers are also responsible for cleaning up after themselves and their guests. Disposal receptacles are for dog waste only. All other waste and recycling must be taken home with the 5

9. [CHC/MDS] It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class.

10. [CHC/MDS] A silent toy may be carried by the handler when running FEO only. Food is not permitted within the ring boundary at any time.

11. [CHC] Toys and all other belongings must be left outside the ring or in the exit pen, and not within the ring boundary.

[CHC/MDS] Items to be left in the exit pen are to be placed there by the handler before they enter the ring or entry pen.

12. [CHC] Dogs are only permitted in the ring to complete during their run and should not be in the ring at any other time.

13. [CHC] "White Dogs" runs may be used at the judge's discretion. White Dogs are not permitted to compete on the same course they ran as a white dog.

14. [CHC] Handlers and dogs may only enter the ring once instructed to do so.

[MDS] A leash bucket will be mounted on the entry gate for the handler to place their leash upon entry. The leash will be placed in the bucket on the exit gate by the leash runner for collection at the end of the run.

15. [CHC] Leashed may be placed in the handler's pocket before their run starts. If the dog interacts with the leash during the run the team will be eliminated.

16. [CHC] Handlers must not make any deliberate contact with any equipment during their run.

17. [CHC] Handlers may not pass over, under or through any equipment during their run.

18. [CHC] Leashes must be left at the gate. The leash cannot be left in the DHB or at the first obstacle.

19. [CHC/MDS] Awards must be collected on the day of the trial.

20. [MDS] All participants must agree to, and provide a signed electronic copy Millennium Dog Sports Waiver of General Liability. Read it <u>here</u> now.
